Safety Requirements

ELECTRONIC DEVICES



When walking, ensure safe surroundings and stop motion prior to use

Use a hands-free device when driving

EYE AND EAR SAFETY



Protect your eyes and hearing in production, factory or operations areas.

PARKING LOTS / INTERSECTIONS



Use crosswalks and crossovers.

Look both ways

Make yourself visible to vehicles, and make eye contact with drivers.

SAFETY LINES



Stay on crosswalks and walkways.

Observe and obey posted signs.

Be aware of vehicles, cranes, moving equipment and other potential hazards around you.

STAIRWAYS



Use handrails on stairways.

Take one step at a time.

OFFICE AISLES



Be aware, slow down and look around at intersections.

PROTECTIVE FOOTWEAR



Always wear appropriate footwear.

Mobile Devices

The use of *mobile phones* is prohibited while driving or operating any vehicle or powered equipment (personal or company) on Boeing property unless the vehicle is parked safely. Use of mobile phones are allowed only while stationary, in designated break areas, offices, or spaces away from active work zones.

Safety Glasses

Safety glasses or enhanced eye protection is required in all Boeing factories and production areas (including aisle ways) unless in a designated Safety Zone. Glasses are generally found in bins near the entrances of each factory door. Personally provided safety glasses must comply with the industry standard (ANSI Z87.1) for safety glasses.

General Site Requirements

- Do not enter a production area without a Boeing host.
- Observe all signs with instructions for personal protection and safety.
- Appropriate footwear (made of leather or other cut and abrasion resisting material, completely enclosed foot - including toes and heel, and flat heels less than two inches).
- Hearing protection (earplugs) will be provided in production areas where required.
- Avoid roped-off areas.
- Maintain a safe distance from all operational controls, systems, moving machinery, and equipment.
- Crane operations are hazardous. Be aware of, and stay away from, suspended loads.
- Smoking is prohibited in all Boeing Wichita buildings and is only allowed in designated smoking areas.

When reporting an emergency, provide the nature of the emergency and location including:

- Building number, Floor & Column Number
- Your name
- Phone number you are calling from

Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) units are located in each building. For questions about the Wichita Site AED program, call 316-526-2222.

Emergency Location Information

Emergency Evacuation signs are posted at each elevator lobby, stairwell, and exit. Shelter In Place areas are marked in yellow and black and Storm Shelter areas are marked in blue. Your host is responsible to provide you specific instructions for the areas you may visit regarding evacuation routes and severe weather shelters.

In the Event of an Emergency

- Follow your host – or other Boeing personnel to a safe location.
- If you have an accident or become injured during the visit, please contact your Boeing host.
